This season, freestyle is taking new proportions at Stoneham! With its TELUS XL terrain park and the biggest half-pipe in the East, the World Cup events and the supercharged calendar of events, those on the lookout for action will have only one place to go: Stoneham Mountain Resort! Great snow conditions, a trail network that spreads over 4 mountains, fantastic lodging at the foot of the hill, legendary *après-ski* and the resort is located only 20 minutes away from Quebec City, which is celebrating its 400th anniversary all year long... Stoneham is without a doubt THE ski destination of your winter!

CAN YOU HANDLE IT?

The resort is constructing a Moby Dick of a half-pipe – the beastly creature is so huge it will have riders and skiers feeling as if they've been swallowed. The Olympic sized infrastructure is the biggest of its kind in the East: 22 feet high, 130 feet wide and 850 feet long and imposes itself in the TELUS XL snow park. The construction of such an infrastructure has allowed Stoneham to be credited as National training center for freestyle snowboarding, thereby confirming its position as an industry leader.

TRAINING CENTER FOR THE ATHLETES OF TOMORROW

The infrastructures and facilities at the resort provide a great learning environment for beginners and a challenging training for seasoned athletes - that is why the Canadian Snowboard Federation has recognised us a National training center for freestyle snowboarding. In addition, Stoneham will be hosting the World Cup once more, from March 5th to 9th 2008.

ENTER THE NEW DIMENSION

Renowned for its great snow conditions, Stoneham has established a new priority in the past 5 years: to offer high-end terrain parks and facilities to freestyle enthusiasts. Always pushing back the limits, the resort opened a TELUS XL snow park where the stunts are so huge they had to restrict the access to experienced skiers and riders only! The park is complete with kink rails, boxes, 45 feet table-tops, a wall ride, 20 feet plus rails, 3D boxes and a half-pipe for the brave only. While the best tracks blare, the TELUS XL snow park gives you the adrenalin rush you've been craving. A quad chairlift takes you up day and night. Meticulously taken care of, the manual grooming budget has gone up 30% in the past year! Twice a day, all of our parks are checked and cared for by our team of Park Rangers. We always ensure the best environment to allow skiers and riders to evolve in their sport.

In a very much appreciated initiative, the ski patrol visits the family zone twice more often, and there is continued surveillance in our TELUS XL snow park to provide a higher level of safety. Finally, maintenance has and continues to be one of our top priorities. Our many endeavors for a safer resort have been recognized by our peers – we have been awarded by the Quebec Ski Resorts Association the title of the *best prevention and safety program!*

ROCK THE SEASON!

This winter, Stoneham is getting the party started with a huge pre-season blow out! The November Chill event, on the 24th of November, will feature rail jams, live music on the terrace, a flurry of industry people, animation and partying until the wee hours... A BIT OF HISTORY

At the beginning of the 60's, over twenty ski amateurs from the Québec City and Trois-Rivières business districts invest some 300 000 \$ to put together three ski trails and two ski lifts (T-Bar and double chairs) at Stoneham. More than forty years later, the realization of their dream was transformed into a ski resort with international reputation for all-level skiers, day like evening.

The site was finally chosen by Walter Moisan who noticed, in the horseshoe shape of Stoneham, incredible qualities for this "snow hole". Snow falls abundantly and remains there, offering ideal ski conditions. At that time, should it be pointed out, one did not yet speak about snowmaking. The geographical situation of the site offers exceptional snow conditions and protects skiers from the wind, in addition to offering a fabulous decor.

The company knows a stable growth until its acquisition, in 1979, by the businessman Marc Blondeau, owner of the shoe manufacture of the same name. After eight years, Stoneham's developments get ahead of Tremblant, Orford and Sutton resorts. The ski resort becomes owner of the entire valley, comprised of six mountains based on a 2,300-acre territory. Mr. Blondeau exploits about half of it. It is also under its impulse that new establishments are built including a hotel, shops, condominiums and a new welcome centre.



Since July 9, 1998, Stoneham belongs to Resorts of the Canadian Rockies. Skiers and riders will find 32 trails spread over four mountains, of which half are enlightened when the evening comes. That makes it the most brilliant resort in Canada with the most memorable snowpark that includes a 17-foot wall superpipe, a wall ride, several rails and obstacles.

Strong with its 40 years experience, Stoneham Mountain Resort will remain extraordinary with the best snow conditions in eastern Canada and its irresistible charm. It will always stay the perfect meeting point for all snowsports lovers, from youngsters looking for extreme sensations, to families



RENOWNED FREESTYLE

At Stoneham, snowboarders have access to every trail, without any restrictions. In addition, free style rules thanks to our many parks, a boardercross path, a slopestyle course and our Olympic size half-pipe. New safety regulations at the resort now stipulate that helmets are mandatory in all snow parks.

Top of the line facilities, parks and equipment

Renowned for the quality of our snow conditions, Stoneham has begun redirecting some of its efforts in the past few years to make freestyle installations one of our top priorities. Proactive, the Stoneham Mountain Resort has not ceased improving and remodeling its parks and layout, following different trends in the sport to ensure the best environment possible for our athletes to evolve in and to give thrill-seekers a run for their money! To name only a few of our recent actions: we've opened a TELUS XL snow park and have held two *Design your stunt* contests, where park users get to design the stunt of their dreams and we produce it.



TELUS XL – restricted access snow park

Maintaining our coveted position as industry leader, Stoneham (and its sister resort Mont-Sainte-Anne) is offering the most daring terrain park in the province. Open only to experienced riders and free-skiers, a new restricted access TELUS XL snow park boasts the features qualified as X-Large. They are of larger size, which can include higher launch ramps, larger gaps between the ramp and the feature, taller, stronger angles and kinks, more pronounced shapes and combinations or sequences of features which require a lot more skill. The access to the parks is therefore restricted to skiers and riders of intermediate and expert level.

To obtain access, one must first take part in the awareness session explaining the safe attitude to adopt when entering an XL zone, the importance of knowing one's own skill level before trying a feature, as well as the necessity of using the features responsibly. Riders and free-skiers who have experienced the vastness and the variety of their new playground know they've been to 7th Heaven...



STONEHAM, INTERNATIONAL PLAYGROUND

The resort has always guaranteed the best conditions to freestyle lovers. The resort has been on the cutting edge of industry trends and is always concerned with offering a playground that meets the highest industry standards, as well as its client's desires. The facilities at Stoneham allow for beginners to learn in a safe and encouraging environment and to challenge professional athletes. Important investments have been made to allow the construction of such infrastructures and facilities, allowing the practice of the sport. The grooming budget for the parks has been increased by 30% in the past year. Also, more than 2 Million dollars have been invested in infrastructures allowing to welcome the World Cup circuit and, at the same time, to offer an international caliber playground to the people of Quebec.

The Stoneham mountain resort has seen athletes such as Hugo Lemay, Will Lavigne, Charles Gagnon and Phil Paré get started on the slopes. Being credited as a National training center for freestyle snowboard, we bet more and more local athletes will be bursting onto the international scene!

HOW TO GET THERE?

Within 20 minutes of Québec City. Take Highway 73 North and exit at Stoneham. Follow road signs to the resort (6 km).

From Montréal, take either Highway 20 East or 40 East to Highway Henri 1V Nord (#73 North), and Highway 40 East. Take Highway 73 North (Exit 167) and exit at Stoneham. Follow road signs to the resort (6 km).

A regular daily shuttle service is also available from many hotels in Quebec City or in the region to the resort.
